

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) and its partners are working to promote safety at grain elevators. Infectious Diseases in the Workplace

The National Institute of Safety and Health (NIOSH) published the findings of an investigation of infectious diseases in the workplace in the journal Emerging Infectious Diseases. The paper reviewed 66 investigations of infectious diseases from 2006-2015. The researchers found that cases appear to be concentrated in health care, laboratory, animal and public services workers.

Mining Software for Hazard Recognition

A software program called EXAMiner allows mineworkers to test their ability to spot hazards in a photographed surface limestone mine setting or in their own mine in any sector. The program is mineworkers to use during training meetings and pre-shift toolbox talks. EXAMiner is available for download from the NIOSH Mining Program's website.

Changes to Electronic Injury Report Requirements

OSHA announced a final rule regarding the electronic filing of two OSHA forms. Businesses with 250 or more employees are no longer required to send their OSHA *Log of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses* (300) and *Injury and Illness Incident Report* (301) to OSHA electronically. These businesses must still send the OSHA *Summary of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses* (300A) electronically. Read the news release on the OSHA website.

General Industry FAQs for Silica Compliance

OSHA posted <u>frequently asked questions about silica in general industry</u>. OSHA developed the questions and answers with industry and union stakeholders to give guidance on the requirements.

Bulletin on Lithium Batteries in Wearable Devices

A new <u>bulletin</u> from OSHA describes how lithium batteries work and hazards they present if they do not operate correctly. The document gives information on battery damage prevention, suggested training and a list of additional resources on the topic.

Transportation Statistics

The <u>National Transportation Statistics</u> presents statistics on the U.S. transportation system. These include its physical components, safety record, economic performance, the human and natural environment and national security. This is a large online document comprising more than 260 data tables plus data source and accuracy statements, glossary and a list of acronyms and initialisms.

Workforce Sustainability in Construction

This Center for Construction Research and Training report <u>Development of a Workforce Sustainability Model</u> <u>for Construction</u> describes a workforce sustainability assessment tool. High turnover rates in construction have made attracting a young, skilled and competent workforce in construction a challenge.
